6. CEO's Report

The COVID pandemic created unprecedented economic uncertainty which effected the business operations of Surfing Victoria, particularly in the events and program space, which saw us unable to deliver on a full events and programs calendar, and cancellation of the Rip Curl Pro for the second year running.

Despite these cancellations we have still seen some fantastic program outcomes, particularly in Surfers Rescue 24/7, Indigenous and Women and Girls.

Our ability to retain and further the growth and capability of the Surfing Victoria staff has us a more capable organisation to deliver of programs, events and funding requirements as we move back into full operation. There are some very exciting opportunities that will present in the coming 12 months.

As it stands, we are driving towards a full events and programs calendar and we are confident in our recovery process as we move out of COVID restrictions and into the future.

I would like to acknowledge the Board for all their support, and in particular Ash for her guidance and support. Thank you to the staff, we have been in and out of the office all year but I am proud of what we have been able to achieve. I am looking forward to the next 12 months.

7. Financial Report – Period Ending June 30th 2021

Net asset position is slightly down on the previous financial year, but we are in a strong in position in comparison so some other sports who have not fared so well during the challenging COVID period.

2021/2022 CEO REPORT - ADAM ROBERTSON



It certainly has been a challenging 12 months for Surfing Victoria, with COVID19 continuing to impact on our ability to deliver a full events and programs calendar. Our most notable event cancellations were the Australian SUP Titles at Phillip Island, and postponement of the Phillip Island Pro. Fortunately, we did see the Rip Curl Pro at Bells Beach return with a bang. Epic conditions and large crowds greeted the world best surfers.

Likewise the Australian Indigenous Surfing Titles returned to Bells with the largest field of competitors from across the country to date. Following two difficult years we were able to run a full calendar of State rounds and crown our State champions. We held the Victorian ABB Qualifier at the URBNSURF wave pool facility, after five years of waiting, the inaugural 50 Year Storm event was held at Bells Beach in triple overhead size (8-10ft+) waves at the Bells Bowl. Held in memory of former world junior surfing champion Shaun Brooks, the event isn't so much about crowning a winner, but about the coming together of a community all in the name of raising awareness towards mental health issues.

Surfers Rescue 24/7 returned to face-to-face delivery being rolled out in Secondary Schools, along with the continuation of online course, allowing participants the ability to complete in the Surfers Rescue 24/7 program, including the identification of the signs of drowning, step by step CPR, understanding of the many dangers on land and in the water, and performing a virtual reality board rescue. www.surfersrescue.training

SurfBetterNow.com has joined forces with Rip Curl's Rip Curl Club that will be launched in Australia and NZ. The online coaching platform has been really positive for the development of surfers throughout Victoria and around the globe. This platform is available to all surfers with an interest in improving their surfing, with detailed resources available for beginners starting out, right through to elite athletes on the World Championship.

Our Indigenous Surfing Program <https://surfingvic.com/indigenous/> is one of the longest running Indigenous Engagement programs in the country. Now in its 24th year, the program utilises surfing as a vehicle to connect Indigenous Victorians with the ocean, their community and nature whilst learning new skills, water safety knowledge and healthy habits. In the period October 2021 – May 22 we have seen 1008 First Nations people across the state register for programs, 53% of program participants are female.

As CEO I am incredibly proud of our staff and very appreciative for the support and understanding shown from our members, Affiliated Clubs and Surf Schools. I'd also like to thank the Victorian Government, VicHealth, Emergency Management Victoria, Play it Safe by the Water and all our other partners for their continued support of Victorian surfing.

We have some amazing things planned in the Women and Girls space, for our Indigenous and Water Safety programs as well as for sport development over the coming 12 months. We look forward to bringing a full calendar of opportunities to our members into 2022/2023.



2021/2022 CHAIRPERSONS REPORT - ASHLEIGH WALL

After two years navigating the impact of COVID-19, Surfing Victoria was able to recommence a full events and program calendar for the second half of the 2021/2022 financial year.

I would like to express my appreciation to the incredible number of people across the State who have worked hard to navigate the challenges of the past few years to ensure the stability of surfing in Victoria – including our members, boardriders clubs, coaches, judges, surf schools, volunteers and parents.

We were excited to welcome the WSL once again to Bells Beach with the return of the Rip Curl Pro over the Easter period and look forward to welcoming the WSL again in 2023 for the 60th year of competition. The Surfing Victoria team provided event management services for the event, and coaching services to World Tour competitors. It was wonderful to see homegrown surfer India Robinson on the World Tour and competing at Bells Beach.

Our coaching team continues to attract the world's best surfers to our high-performance program, and we are working hard to ensure that aspiring junior surfers across the State are receiving the world's best coaching support. We have also continued to refine and build on our online surf coaching platform 'Surf Better Now' to provide an opportunity for recreational surfers to build their surfing knowledge and skills.

We were also able to formally launch the Surf Her Way Strategy in November 2021. This dedicated strategy celebrates women's surfing in Victoria and provides the platform to grow and retain the number of women and girls participating in surfing at all levels both in and out of the water.

The Victorian Indigenous Surfing Program remains a key focus of Surfing Victoria. Strong Aboriginal community leadership and engagement in culturally safe and engaging environments that are inclusive, respectful, and flexible are the core values of the program and we are committed to ensuring it continues to thrive.

Surfers have continued to play a vital role in performing rescues along our coastline. Surfing Victoria is continuing to deliver the Surfers Rescue 24/7 program which is a free Board Rescue and Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) course for all surfers and recreational water users in Victoria.

The Surfing Victoria Board and staff have also worked hard to adapt to the challenges that have been presented over the past few years, and to innovate and improve our impact as an organisation across all of Victoria. On behalf of the Board, I would like to congratulate the Surfing Victoria staff and volunteers for their hard work. We also thank the Victorian Government and all our partners for their continued support of surfing in Victoria. Without their support, we simply could not exist. Thank you.
